POLICY AND PROCEDURE – THE MILESTONE SOCIETY AWARD

Aim: The Milestone Society should recognise and support the outstanding work of individuals, groups and organisations who pursue and promote the ideas of the Milestone Society by their deeds. This recognition should be freely given and widely advertised to illustrate good practice. In any year there could be one or many Awards given, or none.

Nominations would be submitted to an awards sub-committee for approval from county representatives or individual members. Non-members with knowledge of the work could recommend it to the Society for nomination. People should not be allowed to nominate their own project.

Specification: The Award would be for a local initiative with a successful outcome. Qualification would depend on the judgement of the nominator and the sub-committee. Guidance on the criteria for an award would be published.

The Award would consist of an award certificate and, perhaps, a commemorative plaque if appropriate.

Presentation The Award would be presented by a member of the Milestone Society at a local venue or at a Society meeting.

Promotion: The Award should be advertised and the winners announced in all of the Society's media and at Society meetings. Notification of the Awards should be sent to other organisations and publications concerned with conserving heritage assets.

Timescale: The Awards should be made as quickly as possible after nomination, agreement by the sub-committee and ratification by the Executive Committee.

The first awards should be made before the end of 2023.

Review: This procedure will be reviewed as required and at a minimum every three years.

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
